REGULAR MEETING Minutes
June 8, 2023
9:30 am
Augusta Community Center, Augusta Montana
and via Zoom conferencing

9:30am-The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jeff Ryan at 9:30 am. In attendance were Jeff Ryan, Sarah Howe-Cobb, Stan Frasier, and Skyler Van Dyken. John Baucus joined the meeting at 9:43 am. Also in attendance Tracy Wendt, Cody Barnes, Becky Ayre, Andrew Kretschmer, Sawyer Reagan, Joe Kremer-Herman and Chris Evans. On zoom was Danika Holmes from DNRC.

Introductions-Introductions were made.

**Minutes** — motion by Jeff Ryan to approve the minutes as sent, second by Sarah Howe, motion carried.

**Financial Statement**—motion by Jeff Ryan to approve the financial statement and to pay the outstanding bills, second by Frasier; motion carried.

**Supervisor absences**-Karl Christians was an excused absence. Jeanette Nordahl had not called in about her absence.

**Correspondence**-Evans shared what little correspondence we had, including a thank you from the Montana Biological Weed Control project.

Public Comment - There was none.

#### Reports

Printed reports are absolutely welcome.

NRCS-Becky Ayre and Andrew Kretschmer were present to give the NRCS report. Becky introduced Sawyer, the Pathways student for the summer. 16 applications are pre-approved, with 3 more probably getting ready this week.

DNRC-Report in the packet.

SRWG-Tracy Wendt was present to make the SRWG report. Emily Kemp with the MCC is the Conservation Fellow working with the Sun River Watershed Group. She worked with Chris Evans for a day doing some social media work while Tracy was on leave. The Muddy Creek Project will likely get going soon. It's about the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of that Task Force. Focus on weeds started this week with a spray day out at Elk Creek this week. The 20<sup>th</sup> or 21<sup>st</sup> is the Sun Canyon Spray Day with the Forest Service. The 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Weed Whacker Rodeo is July 8<sup>th</sup>. The Predict the Peak turned into a raffle, and Tracy is doing some other fund-raising efforts. Tracy is still looking for someone from Lewis and Clark CD to sit on the SRWG board. MRCDC-Report from Molly Masters in the packet. Jeff Ryan highlighted that the main thing is that they sent a letter to BLM about the rule changes that are proposed.

**WQPD**-Jeff Ryan attended via zoom at their last meeting. They're still working on the strategic plan. They did indicate that they want to be a major partner/participant if/when we get the conservation center going.

LHWG-this group is looking for board members and the Watershed Festival is coming up too. Helena CORE group-Joe Kremer-Herman is sitting in on these meetings for the CD. The group has started their Education Summer Walk Series and the CD is doing 2 again, one on Streams later this month and one on Wetlands in July.

MACD-Spring Board meeting this week. Evans presented on behalf of the Employee Organization, and they hosted a BBQ on Wednesday night.

### **Supervisor Reports**

Jeff Ryan said that Ian Robertson mentioned that he's getting some mortality on his willows on the soil lift on Lake Helena. It's some kind of fungus that attacks mostly young plants.

Sarah Howe-Cobb-commented on the green, rain and flowers. John Baucus-apologized for being late. It is very green, but the DNRC was fighting a fire in

Wolf Creek Canyon just a few days ago.

Staff Reports-Evans included a written report for the board in the packet, Joe Kremer-Herman introduced himself to those he had not yet met.

#### **Old Business**

Decision on Liability Coverage-Discussion about the cost of the insurance. Jeff thinks it's worth it and John Baucus concurred. Motion by Ryan to approve payment of the full price, second by Frasier. Motion carried.

#### **New Business**

Augusta FFA program multi-year donation potential-Cody Barnes introduced their program and handed out a report to the group. He's accepting donations, no specific amount. He said the money they've raised so far has been spent on hotels. The group is hoping to get a calf pulling machine that the kids can learn hands-on. He has some funding for it, but is looking for more. 75% to 80% of the FFA students in Augusta's chapter come from Ag families. He is working to separate the FFA chapter work from the Augusta Ag Ed program. He'd like to get a hydroponics set up going too. Motion by Ryan to commit to giving the program \$500 per year for 5 years, amended by John Baucus to hinge on Cody being part of the program with an annual report with the invoice every year, second by Howe-Cobb; motion carried as amended. During the Augusta Rodeo, they're going to have a cornhole tournament between the store and the Buckhorn. The bars will be donating raffle baskets too.
